Since 1972, the Peter Blum Family YMCA of Boca Raton has been touching lives. For some people, the Y is a place to stay in shape or gather with good friends. For parents, it's a healthy place to take kids and enjoy activities as a family. Still others devote themselves to the Y because the Y gave to them.

Jose Flamenco, for example, first came to the Boca Raton YMCA for swim lessons when he was part of a summer camp for children of migrant workers. The campers received free lessons at the Y twice a week. Today, Jose is studying education at Florida Atlantic University and working at the Y as a counselor.

Jose, like thousands of other people, understands that the YMCA is so much more than a workout facility. It's a place where strong kids, families and communities are built.

YMCA ROOTS

Thanks to the vision and generosity of people like Peter and Teena Blum, Richard and Helen DeVos, and the Countess deHoernle, the Y has grown from a single branch to today's YMCA of South Palm Beach County association, with the DeVos-Blum Family YMCA of Boynton Beach and YMCA@ 901 at the NCCI headquarters as fellow members.

Each year, thousands of people, from infants to seniors, come through the YMCA doors as members or program participants to enjoy the childcare offerings or join in on hundreds of aquatics, sports, fitness and recreational options.

Even more people are signing up every day to be part of the YMCA's beautiful new facility. Serving this growing membership in a new home, however, requires greater support than ever from generous individuals and companies who share the YMCA's passion for bringing healthy activities to the entire community.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE

The new state-of-the-art YMCA reflects specific requests from the community to provide additional space for youth, indoor sports, upgraded fitness facility, more space for family recreation and expanded aquatics programs.

The result is a beautiful new and renovated 70,000-square-foot facility that includes a second enclosed pool, a full court gymnasium, an expanded fitness center, new all purpose rooms, two new preschool classrooms, new locker rooms, a café, a new lobby and a fully accessible playground for children of all abilities.

The Y will be able to grow its membership and preschool enrollment by at least 50 percent. Yet, membership and program fees from these new participants will not be enough to cover the cost of the new buildings and ongoing programs and operational costs.

HELP BUILD A LEGACY

The YMCA of South Palm Beach County's master building plan, which was formulated in the mid 1990's, called for a new Y facility in Boynton Beach and a renovation and expansion of the YMCA in Boca Raton. What has resulted is two state-of the art facilities, the DeVos-Blum Family YMCA of Boynton Beach (opened in 2000) and the renovated and expanded Peter Blum Family YMCA of Boca Raton.

The total capital campaign to build these two facilities is \$16 million, and about \$9 million has been raised to date through gifts and pledges.
